#### BRIEF REPORT ON THE FIRE INCIDENT AT BALAKA DHO 31st July, 2020

The fire started around early hours of 2 and 3am of 31 July 2020. By the time it got noticed it was rife and raging and spreading to other connected blocks. Surrounding people and staff intervened to stop the fire from spreading further till the fire brigade came to extinguish. The kitchen and laundry building has been completely consumed. The laundry building also houses part of stores and data office which have been destroyed in the fire. The rest of the hospital buildings were not directly affected by the fire. Patients were quickly evacuated soon as the fire was noticed and have since been referred to neighboring district hospitals (Ntcheu and Machinga). There were around 147 patients admitted. Some equipment and other materials have been shifted within the hospital premises for safety.

## PROBABLE CAUSE OF THE FIRE

The probable cause of the fire is suspected to be an electrical fault that originated from one of the oil pots in the kitchen.

#### PRELIMINARY LIST BURNT EQUIPMENTS AND SUPPLIES

The list of items and property believed to have been destroyed by the fire is attached here with. However, it is also important to note that some items have been lost during the movements, the extent of which is yet to be established. Most notable items lost during evacuation include, heavy duty aprons, heavy duty gloves, extinguishers, portable oxygen cylinders, extension phones, trolleys, Preventing Protective Equipment (PPE).

After the fire incident, there were a number of activities and measures taken;

We had the deputy Minister of Health and some health management officials from headquarters who came to see the extent of the damage the fire had caused, there were a few recommendations from the ministry team;

- We should come up with a make shift plan to resume hospital services.
- We should renovate the unfinished buildings which were meant for kitchen and laundry.
- We should first assess the electrical wiring and water connections first before rushing into resuming services at the main district hospital.

For the mean time no admissions are going to be done at the District Hospital as all those needing admissions are to be referred to Machinga and Ntcheu Hospital thereby stretching our already small budget for the Hospital further. Our health workers are to be helping in carrying out other operations in nearby districts there by increasing our off duty station allowances budget.

No corona patients are to be admitted at District Hospital.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

## **Immediate Recommendations**

- The list of equipment that was damaged needs replacement for us to resume to our normal service delivery.
- Council to support with additional fuel and allowances to support health workers working in Machinga and Ntcheu.

## **Long Term Recommendations**

- The building should be demolished and a new one should be constructed subject to a report by the director of buildings.
- Provision of fire engine to Balaka district council for response to future incidents if they happen

- We need large morgue tents to be supplied to the district hospital for emergencies like these.
- To prevent and mitigate future occurrences of the fire accidents, we have outlined the following
  - o Fire extinguishers should be checked and serviced regularly.
  - o Smoke detectors to be installed for curbing of future emergencies.
  - o The whole electrical system to be assessed and if need be reworked
  - o Fire hydrants to be supplied to the district hospital and all other major buildings
  - We should have refresher fire drills
